Construction (Design & Management) Regulations 2007 (CDM2007)

The Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2007 (CDM2007) came into force on 6 April 2007. They replace the Construction (Design and Management) 1994 (CDM94) and the Construction (Health & Safety and Welfare) Regulations 1996 (CHSW). This Approved Code of Practice (ACOP) provides practical guidance on complying with the duties set out in the Regulations. It replaces the ACOP to the Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 1994 from 6 April 2007.

Gilpin Demolition's senior management have already undergone a 1 day training course for the New Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2007 at Nobles Health & Safety. Further training will be supplied to site managers as the year progresses.

ONGOING AND FORTH COMING PROJECTS

ST.AUSTELL TOWN CENTRE PROJECT



The St.Austell Town Centre Project has now been running for the past two years, which in that time we have demolished the Night Club 2XS, The Multi Storey Car Park and Tesco's Superstore. The final phase of the demolition is to demolish the 70ft Cinema. Works will commence in February 2007 and continue throughout the year.

WHEAL JANE CORNWALL



The Former Old Mill Building at the Wheal Jane Factory in Cornwall was one of the largest tin processing plants in the World dealing with all the Tin from Wheal Jane & South Crofty Mines. Gilpin Demolition have started works and due to take approximately Two months.....

EATON'S FACTORY PLYMOUTH



The Ex-Eatons Factory is to be Demolished over a 5 Month period in the Plymouth Area. These works are inclusive of the removal of extensive Asbestos Flock and AIB, including 500t of Asbestos Cement Sheet Roofing. Complications being that the building is the flight path of Plymouth Airport, with landing lights requiring relocation whilst a live airport.
